Inspired by the iconic photoshoot by [Richard Avedon](#), this portrait contains a 'slice' of psychedelia - representing the years of John's life where he and his bandmates regularly dropped acid, smoked marijuana, and created some of the best music to come out of the 1960s. The monochromatic columns on either side, however, show that he was just a normal guy, with normal problems; despite being one quarter of the most popular band the world had ever seen.

Jack Nicholson was one of the most prolific actors of the second half of the 20th century and even into the first decade of the 21st. I wanted to show how colorful of a character Jack is, hence the palette I chose, and also that quintessential smirk he is known for. Sunglasses, cigarette, and eyebrows - need I say more? As I do with all my pieces, I hid many caps that pertain to Jack's life and career. To name a few: A hand showing five fingers (Five Easy Pieces), 'JK' (playing the Joker in Batman), 'Easy Jack' (Easy Rider), '12' (number of Oscar nominations), 'triple' (number of Oscar wins), '98' (the year he won best actor), '2010' (the year of his last film), and many more.
